

School of Excellence in Education will continue its policy to operate the Community Eligibility Program (CEP) under the National School Lunch Program and School Breakfast Program for the 2017-18 school year. Schools qualifying to operate CEP serve breakfast and lunch to all children at no charge and eliminate the collection of meal applications for free, reduced-price, and paid student meals. This new approach reduces burdens for both families and school administrators and helps ensure that students receive nutritious meals.

La Escuela de Excelencia en Educación continuará su política para operar el Programa de Elegibilidad Comunitaria (CEP) bajo el Programa Nacional de Almuerzo Escolar y el Programa de Desayuno Escolar para el año escolar 2017-18. Las escuelas que califiquen para operar CEP sirven el desayuno y el almuerzo a todos los niños sin cargo y eliminan la recolección de solicitudes de comidas para comidas gratuitas, a precio reducido y para estudiantes pagados. Este nuevo enfoque reduce las cargas para las familias y los administradores escolares y ayuda a garantizar que los estudiantes reciban comidas nutritivas.
